
3. WEATHER CONDITIONS AND VISIBILITY AT TIME WHEN LAST REPORTED:

Limited surface reports at the time of flight show scattered cloud at point of departure at four thousand feet with visibility of ten to fifteen miles; at Corsica two thousand three thousand feet over cast with twelve to thirty miles visibility; at the Marseilles—Istres area two thousand to three thousand feet overcast, visibility eight to twelve miles in intermitten light rain; at Lyon clear skies with one to two miles visibility in fog; at Orly one thousand to two thousand feet overcast with visibility two to six miles in haze and intermittent drizzle. Destination at ETA was scattered to broken at six hundred to one thousand feet to one thousand feet visibility two to six miles in haze, intermittent light rain and rain showers. Weather personnel are of the opinion that the above reports fail to show the instability, turbulent and icing conditions present over the initial portion of the route over the Tyrrhenian and Ligurian seas.
