- This Headquarters has assumed the responsibility of compiling the official report concerning this missing aircraft because the flight commander, pilot and co-pilot, were assigned to headquarters European Air Transport Services.
- 3 I personally have read the attached report.
- I concur in the report. The aircraft is missing. The cause is unknown. All crew members were sufficiently experienced to preclude the probability that an accident occurred due to the inexperience of the aircrew personnel.
- This headquarters is continuing to place emphasis on adherence to a flight plan filed prior to flight departure. Emphasis is also placed on the need for continual radio checks with ground stations, made by the radio operator, on continuous wave frequencies. Night cross country flights have been discontinued by European Air Transport Service.
